Curating Community Digital Collections: Summer 2018 Practicum Experience

The Institute of Museum and Library Services selected WiLS (Wisconsin Library Services) to receive a FY2017 Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Program grant for this initiative. WiLS, in partnership with Recollection Wisconsin, the UW-Madison's iSchool and the UW-Milwaukee's School of Information Studies, will provide library school graduate students with practical experience in digital stewardship through summer fieldwork positions at small and under-resourced memory institutions across Wisconsin.

General Expectations for Host Site Supervisors

- Before the placement begins, work with the Program Coordinator to develop a detailed project plan, including expected outcomes, activities and tasks.
- Supervise assigned practicum student throughout the placement period.
- Offer opportunities for student to understand the day-to-day work of your organization provide a tour, introduce the student to other staff members/volunteers, and, if possible, allow the student to attend at least one business meeting.
- Supply adequate space, materials and equipment required for the successful completion of the project (a small amount of funding for necessarily supplies and equipment is available).
- Familiarize yourself with your student's course requirements. Students must enroll in and complete either LIS620 (UW-Madison) or INFOST990 (UW-Milwaukee) during the placement period.
- Join all project participants in an orientation webinar in mid-April 2018.
- Participate in a 3-day Immersion Workshop in Madison on May 22-24, 2018. All travel costs paid.
 - o Day 1: Building connections and fostering an environment of support among the cohort.
 - o Day 2: Overview of digital preservation issues.
 - o Day 3: Applied skills training.
- Be timely and professional in all communications and interactions with students, mentors, and CCDC staff.
- Be engaged, inquisitive and receptive to questions and communications from your student and their mentor.
- Participate in communications during the placement period:
 - o Two group check-in conversations facilitated by the Program Coordinator (by phone, webinar or video conference).
 - o Mid-summer in-person site visit with Program Coordinator, mentor and student.
 - o Use interactive communication channels such as BaseCamp and Slack to post questions and share project updates.
- Reconvene with full cohort for a virtual capstone event in August or September 2018. Supervisors will be invited to comment on challenges, successes and future directions.
- Complete a self-assessment before and after the placement to document increases in professional knowledge and institutional capacity.
- Commit to continuing project work after the placement concludes, and complete long-range surveys at six months and two years to measure status and impact of local projects.
